# **About Changing Chances**

Changing Chances CIC was founded in 2019 with a mission to improve the life chances of every child and young person, whatever challenges life throws in their way.

We are a not-for-profit organisation with a mission to shift the world away from traditional behaviourist approaches towards ones which are neuroinclusive and support all children to feel great, do well and feel a strong sense of belonging within their communities.

Changing Chances CIC provides training for professionals within schools, wider educational provision, youth justice, social care and health as well as courses for foster carers, kinship carers, adoptive and birth parents and guardians. Our flagship programme, 'The Empowerment Approach®' weaves neurobiology, psychology, education and coaching to empower young people and the adults around them with an understanding of the brain and the tools to feel and do better.

Our work is founded on a single aim: to improve life chances for all children and young people. However, we know that life doesn't create a level playing field for all. That's why we focus especially on supporting young people experiencing disadvantage due to the intersectionality of trauma, neuro-difference, mental health and poverty. We offer a range of services for schools, families and professionals working with children.

#### **Our work in Education Provision:**

**Training:** We have provided Empowerment Approach training and support to a total of 83 schools and education settings, representing 31000 children and young people from across Kent, Hampshire, East Sussex, West Sussex and Brighton & Hove.

Leadership Coaching: We have also continued to coach Headteachers and school leaders across across nursery, primary and secondary schools.

With commissions from ESCC and BHCC, in addition to involvement in the Kent headteacher coaching programme, we have now provided leadership coaching for almost five years to over 150 school leaders.

#### Our work in Social Care & Other Children's Services:



In addition to our work in schools, we have also delivered Empowerment Approach training courses to:

- Groups of foster carers, kinship carers and adopters to groups across East Sussex and Brighton and Hove
- Sussex police officers and staff
- A constellation as part of the Mockingbird programme, taking place within the Hub Home
- Staff working in Alternative Education Provision in Brighton, Crawley and Worthing

 Early Help Workers, Social Workers and Youth Workers across East Sussex.

   Community Foundation to present the importance of family coaching to support vulnerable children
- Presenting at the BHCC Social Work Conference: Supporting the Workforce Through a Neurobiological Lens
- Delivering a keynote presentation at the West Sussex County Council SENDCO conference

As part of our Sussex Police Partnership, we have continued to provide family coaching, supporting 140 families.









This work allows us to provide direct support to young people, aged 7 to 18, who are struggling and are presenting with challenges socially, emotionally or in learning.

We provide individualised coaching, working with the young person, their parents/ carers and other family members.

In these sessions, the coach works with the young person and their family to explore barriers to success and ensure they can achieve across all areas of their lives, by:

- understanding the neurobiology and executive functioning that may be contributing to their difficulties
- building key weaker skills
- designing strategies and scaffolds to support any specific neurodifferences.



## Impact: Schools



Schools who have implemented The Empowerment Approach effectively, have reported the approach as having a significant impact on behaviour and attitudes across the school.

66 This will lead to better educational outcomes.

#### Reported impact has included:

- increased staff confidence and skills
- improved learning engagement
- improved relationships
- improved pro-social skills and a reduction in instances of anti-social behaviour
- individuals with higher needs building better regulation skills, leading to fewer escalations
- removing barriers to attendance
- reduced use of leadership time to support behaviour
- a reduction in exclusions



Feedback from participants of our Family Coaching sessions indicates that young people and their families benefit from significant positive impacts from the coaching.





# Programme Development



We use insights from our research, feedback from programme participants, and newly emerging evidence to continue to improve and develop The Empowerment Approach.

#### Our Empowerment Approach Handbook has been revised and developed:

A new structure provides greater cohesion across the course, and further detail has been added to each module to provide clarity and exemplification. In addition, structured reflection has been included to allow participants to contemplate their own practice and consider how the key messages from the course will impact how they support children moving forwards.

New resources have been created to support children and young people's understanding of The Empowerment Approach, including:

- A new Executive Function Tracking booklet
- A new Brain Needs Check & Scaling booklet
- Updated Coaching Cards deck
- New animations to provide accessible and engaging ways to access more of our key messages, tools and concepts





New curriculum resources have been created to support the implementation of The Empowerment Approach in schools:

Easily accessible, structured learning materials have been designed to reduce teacher workload whilst ensuring the integrity of The Empowerment Approach is closely adhered to.

Further steps have been taken in the development of our self-study Learning Platform, due to completed by the end of 2025.

#### This platform will be instrumental in:

- Protecting our intellectual property
- Building our passive income
- Scaling up our services.
- Providing staff from schools and other organisations who have attended our training course with sustainable professional development
- Enabling us to further spread our message and training





# **Business Development**

We continue to to grow and develop our business so that we can reach more individuals, families and organisations, achieve new goals and strive towards our future mission.



#### Our business development this year has included:

- Being awarded a 3 year grant from Sussex Community Foundation
- Creating a new, improved shopfront selling our resources which, once the Learning Platform is complete, will enable individuals to purchase training and resource bundles.
- Building up our services to include supervision for staff with a focus on improving the capacity of staff to support vulnerable children and young people
- Growing the team to support scaling up, including the recruitment of:
  - a new member of the board
  - four new Family & Young People Coaches
  - three new trainers
  - a new member of the team to support the CEO with internal operations, strategic planning and programme development.



### **Next Steps**

Our core future mission is to shift the national approach from behaviourism to psychoeducation and coaching so that all children and young people experience a positive childhood and are empowered to become highly engaged individuals who are confident self-advocates, exhibiting high levels of self-responsibility.
